
FAQS AND THE MODEL MERGER DEED ON ICAI (MERGER AND DEMERGER OF CA FIRMS) GUIDELINES, 2024

In line with its commitment to facilitate ease of practice and support professional growth, CACAF released a comprehensive set of Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) along with a Model Merger Deed under the revised ICAI (Merger & Demerger of CA Firms) Guidelines, 2024. These resources are designed to provide practical, actionable guidance, addressing commonly encountered issues and clarifying procedural and interpretational aspects to ensure smooth adoption of the Guidelines by CA firms.

The FAQs serve as a ready reference tool, offering clear explanations and guidance on key operational and compliance matters. Complementing this, the Model Merger Deed provides a structured framework for operationalizing mergers, covering essential provisions such as governance and management

structures, terms of merger, dispute resolution mechanisms, client transition processes and confidentiality safeguards. Together, these tools aim to simplify the merger process, ensure legal compliance, and support firms in strategically restructuring to achieve growth and operational excellence.

Developed through extensive consultations, surveys and stakeholder interactions, including an Exposure Draft for public comments on the revised ICAI (Merger & Demerger of CA Firms) Guidelines, 2024, these resources incorporate the real-world challenges, practical insights and perspectives of practicing members.




FAQS ON ICAI (AGGREGATION OF LLPS) GUIDELINES, 2024

In January 2025, the ICAI (Aggregation of LLPs) Guidelines, 2024 were notified, introducing a comprehensive and forward-looking framework that allows an LLP, Indian CA firm to partner with another LLP, an Indian CA Firm, marking a pathbreaking step in facilitating the sustainable growth and consolidation of CA firms, while preserving professional independence and integrity. Recognising the need to support seamless adoption of these Guidelines, CACAF developed a detailed set of Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) to guide stakeholders in understanding and implementing the framework effectively.

The FAQs address key aspects of the Guidelines, including eligibility criteria, procedural requirements, compliance obligations, and practical implementation considerations. Crafted as a practical reference tool, they provide clear, actionable guidance to help firms navigate the aggregation process with confidence and consistency.

Through this initiative, CACAF bridges regulatory intent with operational practice, enabling CA firms to leverage the aggregation framework to enhance governance, scale operations, foster collaboration and strengthen professional excellence across the sector.



SEQUENCE OF EVENTS- ICAI (GLOBAL NETWORKING) GUIDELINES, 2025

JUNE-JULY 2025

- ▶ In accordance with the Council's decision, the Exposure Draft of the proposed ICAI (Global Networking) Guidelines, 2025 was released on the ICAI website on 6 June 2025 for public comments for a period of 21 days, up to 27 June 2025.
- ▶ Based on stakeholder requests, the deadline for submission of comments was extended up to 16 July 2025.
- ▶ A total of 54 stakeholders submitted comments, resulting in 841 comments (721 specific and 120 general).

2022-23

- ▶ In 2022-23, a Group was constituted to formulate Overseas Networking Guidelines, which held three meetings during the year.
- ▶ The Group was reconstituted in 2023-24 and held four additional meetings to finalize the draft Overseas Networking Guidelines; however, the Guidelines remained at the draft stage.
- ▶ The recommendations of the "Big Indian Firms" strategy group were considered by the Council at its 420th Meeting (March 2023).
- ▶ The Council decided to forward relevant recommendations to the Ethical Standards Board, Committee for Members in Practice, and the Group on Overseas Networking, with a direction to place the matter before the Council on priority.

2021-22

- ▶ At its 402nd Council Meeting (29 June-1 July 2021), the Council resolved to constitute a Group to examine the overall strategy for enabling Indian CA firms to grow and become globally competitive, arising from discussions on the President's opening remarks.

JULY-DECEMBER 2025

- ▶ The Draft Guidelines were reviewed by the Legal Section, ICAI, and feedback was received in track-change mode on 22 July 2025.
- ▶ CACAF undertook a threadbare clause-wise examination of stakeholder meetings comments and legal inputs across multiple meetings:
- ▶ 11th Meeting-17 September 2025
Internal CCM Meeting-24 September 2025
- ▶ Adjourned Meetings – 16 October and 3-4 November 2025
- ▶ 12th Meeting of CACAF (2 December 2025).
- ▶ At the adjourned 12th Meeting of CACAF of 2nd December 2025), the Draft Guidelines were again examined in detail and finalised
- ▶ The revised Draft ICAI (Global Networking) Guidelines, 2025 as finalised by CACAF, were placed before and approved by the Council at its 447th Meeting held on 11 December 2025.

JANUARY-MAY 2025

- ▶ The draft Guidelines were approved by CACAF at its 8th Meeting (2 January 2025) and adjourned meetings held on 9 January and 20 January 2025.
- ▶ The Guidelines were thereafter considered by the Council at its 442nd Meeting (26 May 2025), where it was decided to release the draft for public exposure.

2024-25

- ▶ During 2024-25, the Committee for Aggregation of CA Firms (CACAF) was constituted to comprehensively review and revise firm-related guidelines in line with the evolving professional and global environment.
- ▶ The draft Overseas Networking Guidelines were accordingly referred to CACAF for review, revision, and further action.
- ▶ The draft Guidelines were placed before the Council at Its 433rd Meeting (14-15 August 2024), where it was advised to circulate the draft among all Central Council Members and consider their suggestions through CACAF.

ICAI (GLOBAL NETWORKING) Guidelines, 2025

ICAI (Global Networking) Guidelines, 2025 was recently approved by the Council, at its 447th meeting held on 11th December 2025, subject to notification. These guidelines have been formulated with the objective of facilitating global networking opportunities for Indian CA firms, Domestic Networks of CA Firms, Management Consultancy Services Companies registered with ICAI with a structured, transparent and legally compliant framework to formalize international affiliations and also will enable Domestic Networks of Indian CA firms to grant affiliations to overseas entities across jurisdictions, thereby enabling them to access global opportunities.

The intent underlying these Guidelines is to create an enabling environment where small and medium CA firms can also participate meaningfully in global collaborations at a level playing field. By providing this framework for networking and affiliation, the Guidelines empower Indian firms, to benefit from shared knowledge, specialized expertise, advanced tools and technology, and collective reputation advantages, among others within global networks.






CONSULTATIVE INTERACTION ON “BIG INDIAN FIRM: THE AGGREGATION BLUEPRINT”: MUMBAI

CA institute to issue global networking guidelines for Indian firms: ICAI president

The CA institute will soon issue international networking guidelines to enable domestic firms to spread their footprints abroad, its President Ranjeet Kumar Agarwal has said.

The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) will also review the advertising regulations for its members and relax them in accordance with the current economic milieu and the requirements of a globalised business environment.

"This is also a part of the terms of reference of our committee on 'Aggregation of CA' firms. We believe that this is also required if we want our Indian firms to be global," Agarwal said in an interview. He also said that the review of advertising regulations is also part of the work agenda of the

Committee on Aggregation of firms.

Right now, the ICAI advertising regulation says Indian firms can advertise in digital, print and electronic media as a write-up, which cannot be in a font size above 14, he said.

The committee aims to finalise its report by mid-June and present it to the Central Council in July. 'Aggregation of CA firms' and international networking is going to be a top priority for the CA Institute in the next two months, he added.

FOCUS ON AI

Noting that ICAI is in a "fast track mode" on this front, Agarwal said that the Committee on Aggregation of CA firms has already met thrice and two more are scheduled this month.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in July 2017, during his address at the Chartered Accountants Day event, called

for the creating of four big Indian accounting firms that are counted among the world's Big-8.

Additionally, ICAI is developing a GenAI tool to assist members and students in performing their duties effectively using AI technology.

ICAI also plans to become a paperless organisation by the end of June through its e-office framework.

FM asks ICAI to set up 'Big 4'-like Indian firm

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman (pictured) on Tuesday exhorted the Bihar chapter of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) to set up an Indian auditing firm that will grow to feature among the Big Four and seek global clients. Interacting with the ICAI in Patna, Sitharaman sought a commitment from them to start work on the same as part of their 100-day agenda for Viksit Bharat by 2047.



Urging Bihar to show its leadership skills, the finance minister said that one of the

Big Four CA partnerships should come as the outcome of the Bihari mind. "You should establish a CA firm, strong enough to be reckoned as a top four company... What stops us from doing it?"

Currently, Deloitte, EY, KPMG, and PwC are known globally as the Big Four in the world of accounting.

"Why is it that in spite of the large number of high quality CAs in India — respected all over the world — our CAs become (only) leaders, and partners in Big Four firms. (Why) would you rather become a partner in a Big Four but not form a Big Four in India," Sitharaman asked.

ICAI for new networking model for CA firms

A committee of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) has proposed a new networking model that will allow companies to "tap the synergies of the combined strength and resources".

Firms, where more than 50 per cent of partners are CAs and are registered with the ICAI, may come together to form a Limited Liability Partnership (LLP). They may also join an existing LLP, where more than 50 per cent of partners are CAs and are registered with the institute, as partner firms, the Committee for Aggregation of CA Firms has proposed. ICAI will take public comments on the proposal till June 6.

The new or existing LLP firm inducting partners would be registered with the ICAI, according to the proposal document seen by *Business Standard*.

The proposal said that the firms associated as partners of the LLP would be bound by a written deed allowing them to practise as independent firms simultaneously.

According to the LLP Act 2008, a company constituted within or outside India is eligible to become

Revised Guidelines Likely by March to Create Desi Big 4

Move to help capitalise on \$240 b global auditing & consultancy mkt

New Delhi: The government may finalise a road map for rules overhaul by the March quarter to encourage the setting up of large audit and consultancy firms akin to the Big Four, with the latest data showing less than 1% of accounting firms in India have more than 10 partners each.

A panel under corporate affairs secretary Deepthi Gaur Mukerjee is reviewing various regulatory challenges preventing domestic auditing and consultancy firms from growing in size, and will come out with its recommendations soon, people aware of the details said.

"Necessary regulatory changes could be finalised this fiscal itself," one of them said. While the government is aiming to amend relevant laws at the earliest, changes to regulations would follow they said.

Only 439 of the 106,138 registered chartered accountancy firms had over 10 partners each as of October 1, and just 13 of them had more than 50 each, according to the data compiled by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI).

However, these 439 firms have employed about 15% of the workforce of 183,642, comprising both partners and paid assistants.

Importantly, the top 15 accounting firms together employ about 7% of the total number of partners and paid

assistants, the data showed. These top firms have employed 1,349 partners and 11,543 paid assistants.

The absence of large homegrown firms has allowed the Big Four — EY, Deloitte, KPMG and PwC — to dominate the Indian audit ecosystem.

In a meeting last month, Shaktikanta Das, principal secretary 2 to the prime minister, had deliberated with senior officials from the finance and corporate affairs ministries on steps to facilitate the creation of large homegrown firms.

The government is considering a road map under which rules and regulations would be relaxed to encourage merger and acquisition of local accounting firms, create multidisciplinary partnership firms, facilitate easier tie-ups with global firms and allow all these firms to operate, advertise and raise funds

with ease, ET has learnt. Attaining scale could help Indian firms capitalise on the estimated \$240 billion global auditing and consultancy market.

Last month, the corporate affairs ministry floated an office memorandum, seeking stakeholder comments on allowing multidisciplinary partnership firms where skilled workers from accounting and consultancy professions can work under a single firm structure. Currently there are restrictions on creating such firms.

The ministry's memorandum on multidisciplinary firms has also flagged several bottlenecks in the extant system: the ban on advertising and marketing, presence of different regulators for licensing in different professional services, restrictive public procurement and empanelment processes, and inadequate global collaborations.

Guidelines to Boost Global Tie-Ups for CA Firms Approved: ICAI Chief

New Delhi: The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) has approved two sets of guidelines that would enable domestic audit firms to get into global tie-ups easily and allow chartered accountants to advertise their work better through a revamp of its ethics code, the institute's president Charanjot Singh Nanda said.

The move is part of efforts to facilitate the creation of the domestic Big Four accounting firms by enabling local chartered accountancy (CA) firms to build scale, in sync with the government's goal, Nanda told reporters. The ICAI's top decision-making body has approved these proposals following a two-day huddle that ended on Thursday, he said.

The ICAI (Global Networking) Guidelines, 2025 aim to facilitate global networking opportunities for Indian CA firms, on top of expanding domestic networks,

he said. These stipulate a legally-compliant framework for domestic CA firms to get into international collaborations and grant affiliations to overseas entities as well. The guidelines will also promote the setting up of management consultancy services companies registered with the ICAI, he added.

NEW CODE OF ETHICS

As for the overhaul of the Code of Ethics, the institute has proposed fresh guidelines on audit independence. These would discourage accountants from providing non-audit services to the same listed companies of which they are also the statutory auditors, a bid to minimise the scope for conflict of interest to bolster audit quality, experts said.

The code also proposes new guidelines on a raft of other issues, including sustainability assurance and audit fees, in sync with the goal of creating large home-grown accounting and consultancy firms in India.

Building India's Big Four! Government pushes for large domestic audit firms; encourages global tie-ups

Big Four The Indian government is considering major reforms in the accounting and audit sector as it aims to create domestic firms capable of competing with the Big Four—EY, Deloitte, KPMG, and PwC.

According to the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI), fewer than 1% of registered accounting firms have more than 10 partners, with only 13 firms exceeding 50 partners. Despite these small numbers, 459 firms employ about 15% of the workforce of 183,642, including partners and paid assistants, while the top 13 firms account for 7% of total employees. The dominance of global players in the industry has highlighted the need for large domestic firms capable of meeting the demands of India's growing business and consultancy market. A panel led by corporate affairs secretary Deepthi Gaur Mukerjee is reviewing regulatory hurdles preventing Indian audit and consultancy firms from expanding. "Necessary regulatory changes could be finalised this fiscal itself," a source said, as quoted by ET. The government aims to amend relevant laws and follow up with changes in regulations to allow easier firm aggregation and expansion. Under the Code of Ethics, the changes in the guidelines for advertisement and website are aimed at enhancing accessibility and professional visibility in line with contemporary practices.
